





Guidelines:

Entries to the Film Festival must include:

1. Two DVDs of the film (with English subtitles, if required)

- 2. A completed and signed copy of the entry form
- 3. Three high-resolution stills of the film (can be sent via email)
- 4. A high-resolution photograph of the director (can be sent via email)
- 5. If you have already entered your film in the previous festival, please don't send it.

30th Fajr International Film Festival, Tehran, Iran

The 30th Fajr International Film Festival has wrapped up, announcing national winners during a ceremony held in the capital city of Tehran. Iranian filmmaker Parviz Sheikh-Tadi received the event's Best Director Crystal Simorgh for his *Days of Life*.

The Best Screenplay award went to Mostafa Kiaie for his *Bullet Proof*, which was also selected as the Best Film of the Iranian cinema. Veteran Iranian filmmaker Dariush Mehrjui garnered the Special Jury prize for *Dressed in Orange*. The audience Crystal Simorgh award went to Peyman Moadi for *Snow on the Pines* in the First Time Filmmakers section. Held on the theme of 'Morality, Awareness, and Hope', the 10-day Fajr film festival screened Iranian and international productions in different sections including the World Panorama, the Eastern Vista Asian Cinema,



Salvation Cinema and the Islamic Awakening. Iran holds the international Fajr film, theater, music, visual arts and poetry festivals every year to mark the anniversary of the 1979 Islamic Revolution. The 30th Fajr International Film Festival was held from February 1 to 11, 2012 in Tehran and some other provinces.

The 10-day event provided an opportunity for 26 films to compete for the coveted Crystal Simorgh awards. The motto for this Fajr film festival was "Morality, awareness, and hope" This year the international section of the Fajr film festival had different sections including the World Panorama, the Eastern Vista Asian Cinema and Salvation Cinema. Also a section was dedicated to films on Islamic awakening movement. Like the Oscar presented at the Academy Awards, the Crystal Simorgh or Phoenix is the most prestigious award given by the Fajr international film festival.
